Chicago (III.)--History Hellenic Cultural Circle of Chicago

OBJECT DESCRIPTION

Wooden plaque given to James K. Chelos to honor his service to the community. The plaque was awarded to him by the Hellenic Cultural Circle of Chicago, dated February 23, 1968. The plaque specifies that the award was, "in recognition of his meritorious contributions to our community and to the service of Themis". The plaque is in the shape of a shield. There is a metal wreath attached to the top of the plaque, underneath is the piece of engraved metal which bears the inscription. Admitted into the bar in 1930, James Chelos served as a lawyer in Chicago until 1952, when he was elected to judgeship in Cook County. This made him the first Greek judge in Illinois. Chelos was also a founding member of the Hellenic Bar Association (HBA) of Illinois. The HBA is an organization which was founded in 1951 by Greek immigrants who had become lawyers. The organization stressed unity and community service among its lawyers. Themis is an organization in Chicago which helps young law students prepare for the bar examination. James Chelos, a lawyer himself, was very involved in helping young Greeks pass the bar examination through this organization.
